A. MATERIAL.

All monuments, markers, and cornerstones shall be constructed of granite or quartzite. Plaques attached to a monument or marker must be constructed of bronze.

B. DESIGN OF MONUMENT.

Before any monument may be erected on any lot, there shall be furnished to the Association, a completed plan with the sketch and specifications for it's approval. The sketch shall be to scale, showing both front, back and side views and show the material, sizes, finish, lettering and engraving in detail. The Association my reject any monument or marker for any reason.

C. PLACEMENT OF MONUMENTS.

Monuments shall be placed at the head of a grave and mounted on a base and foundation as specified by the Association. The Association is responsible for the construction of the concrete foundation.

D. PLACEMENT OF MARKERS.

Flat, single or double markers shall be placed at the foot of the grave. So-called "slanting markers" shall be classified as monuments and shall be placed at the head of the grave on a base. Slanting markers without a base are not permitted except in case of matching markers already in place on a lot. If a cremains burial is added to an existing burial, or with two cremains in one grave space, only one marker or monument using both names will be permitted on a single grave space. No markers may be set before burial.

E. PLACEMENT OF CORNER-STONES.

A cornerstone shall be flush with the ground.

F. SPECIAL RULES FOR PLACEMENT OF MONUMENTS AND MARKERS IN THE FOL-LOWING AREAS:

(1) Maple Leaf Addition (Lots are 4' x 10')

Markers in this Addition shall be a single (2' x 1') or a double marker no larger than 4' in length. If a bronze plaque is placed on these beveled markers, the marker can be 4" wider in length and width. Markers shall be set at the foot of the grave on a concrete foundation with a 4" sloping border.

(2) East Knoll, West Knoll, Holly, Walnut, Spruce, Cedar, Linden, Willow, Oak. Pinelawn, Rosehill, Elm, Morningside, Crown Hill, West lawn, Seventh and Cherry Additions If a monument is installed in East Knoll and West Knoll, north of the present location of the hedge, a marker may not be placed at the foot. In parts of East Knoll and West Knoll south of the present location of the hedge, and all other additions described in this section, both monuments and markers are permitted. In all seventeen areas, double monument bases may not exceed 5'6" in length and any monument may not exceed 3'6" in overall height, with the exception of Linden that may not exceed 5' in overall height. Monument bases for a single grave space may not exceed 3' in length.

(3) Sixth Addition (Lots are 4' x 8')

Only 2' x 1' markers may be used in this section.

(4) **Evergreen Plot** (Lots are 3' x 3',3' x 6')

This is the baby section and markers shall be 1' x 6" in the section south of the walkway and 1'4" x 8" in the section north of the walkway.

(5) Westlawn "B" Addition

(Lots are 15' x 12.5') Markers shall be 20" to 24" in length. Monument bases shall not be longer than 7' or shorter than 4'6". Overall height of the monument and the base shall not exceed 3'6". Slanting markers used as a monument and double markers are not permitted in this section.

(6) Summit, Sycamore and Magnolia Additions

(Lots are 15' x 15') Markers shall be 20" to 24" in length. Monument base and height shall be determined by the Association but cannot be shorter than 4'6". Slanting markers used as a monument and double markers are not permitted in these sections.

(7) Eastlawn Addition

(Lots are 4' x 4' - cremains) A single gray marker 2' x 1' with engraving for one or two cremains at the north end of each space. If a cremains urn vault is used only one inurnment is permitted.

(8) Fourth and Fifth Plot, Crown Hill Addition and South Lawn Addition.

Contact the Association office for requirements for monuments or markers in these Additions.

G. GOVERNMENTS MARKERS OR PLAQUES. An order for a government marker or a plaque requires the approval of the Association.

(9) MEMORIAL BENCHES.

Granite or quartzite memorial benches may be used if approved by the Association. Benches shall be set on a concrete foundation and placed on an owner's unused grave space. If this space is later used for a burial, the bench must be either removed from the cemetery or with the consent of the Association, placed on an unplatted area in the cemetery in which case it becomes the property of the Association.

(10) COLUMBARIUM

Single or double inurnments are permitted in each niche. The Association has determined the style of engraving. The engraving shall contain the name, the year of birth and the year of death. No objects may be attached to the columbarium. Flowers, wreaths or small planters or pots may be placed in the provided area. Fresh floral bouquets in metal or plastic vase holders may be placed at the base of a columbarium so as not to obscure the names engraved on the lower levels.


